INFRASTRUCTURE

INDUSTRIAL PARKS:

Aguascalientes is hosting a total of 25 industrial parks. These parks, along with extensive network of roads and highways spanning 1,451 km, form a solid connectivity infrastructure connecting various economic and geographic regions.

HIGHWAYS:

Aguascalientes boasts a robust road connectivity infrastructure, with distances from Saltillo to major Mexican cities ranging from 86 to 2,365 km, and to key US and Canadian cities from 299 to 4,087 km.

AIR FREIGHT:

Aguascalientes has international routes to the United States and numerous daily flights to Mexico City.
